Brian McLaren

Brian D. McLaren is an author, speaker, activist, and networker among innovative Christian leaders.

He graduated from the University of Maryland with degrees in English (BA, MA). In 2004, he was awarded a Doctor of Divinity Degree from Carey Theological Seminary in Vancouver, BC.

He began his career teaching college English. He left teaching in 1986 to become founding pastor of Cedar Ridge Community Church, an innovative, transdenominational church in the Baltimore-Washington region. The church grew to involve several hundred people, many of whom were previously unchurched. In 2006, he left the pastorate to devote full time to writing and speaking.

Brian has been active in networking and mentoring church planters and pastors since the mid 1980's. His public speaking covers a broad range of topics including the gospel and global crises; theology and postmodernity; liturgy, preaching and spiritual formation; evangelism and inter-religious dialogue, and faith and social justice. He has written/edited/co-authored over a dozen books including *A New Kind of Christian* and *More Ready Than You Realize*.



Steve Bell

Steve Bell's career began with a music-making family, grew into a personal fascination with playing guitar, evolved into the lifestyle of a working musician and found its fruition in the musical niche of singer/songwriter.

In the late 1980's, deep in the midst of a significant spiritual re-awakening (and a career crisis), Steve realized that his passion for crafting artful songs was incomplete without a profound connection to his Christian spirituality. This realization produced a wave of songs. The recording and sharing of those songs has in turn unleashed a flood of affirmation and accolades.

Fifteen albums and tireless touring over 20 years have resulted in numerous awards (including JUNOs in 1997 and 2000), the sale of over 300,000 units world-wide, and thousands of loyal fans.

As Steve's music has provided a passport to the wider world, his conviction about the value of good art has deepened. He has added his voice to select organizations calling for an end to extreme poverty and projects directed to caring for those in need. *Steve lives in Winnipeg, Manitoba with his wife, Nanci.*
